



## **Houston Center for Sobriety Emergency Medical Technician**

The Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) performs the intake process for all incoming clients to ensure their stability and ability to remain at the Houston Center for Sobriety (sobering center). The EMT will report to the Intake and Support Supervisor.

### **Responsibilities**

- Conduct intake screening inclusive of taking vital signs, blood alcohol concentration, urine drug screen, and blood glucose levels
- Complete all intake documents in accordance with agency policy and procedures
- Provide exit screening for client discharge as needed
- Provide assistance to Recovery Support Specialist and Psychiatric Technician
- Monitor clients vital signs in accordance with agency policy and procedure
- Provide minor first aid care
- Facilitate transport of clients in need of additional medical services in accordance with agency policy and procedure
- Ensure equipment/tools are functioning properly to provide client care
- Function within the scope of care defined by this facility, along with state regional, and local regulatory agencies
- Attend continuing education and refresher training programs as required by employer
- Document and inform staff and emergency response teams of observations pertinent to client care
- Attend all meetings and trainings as requested
- Adapt to changing work requirements
- Perform related work as assigned

### **Educational Requirements**

- Current Texas License/Certification as EMT Basic
- Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR)
- Basic Life Support Certification or Advance Cardiac Life Support Certification

### **Experience and Skills**

- Excellent communication and documentation skills
- Knowledge and experience in the role of EMT Basic
- Bilingual preferred
- Ability to work cooperatively as a team member
- Ability to accept and follow directions that comply with organization guidelines
- Good decision making skills
